

50th anniversary of books in your language 1974–2024

Dear public library colleagues,

This year we are celebrating 50 years of the Multicultural Bulk Loan Service. With more than 29 per cent of the population of NSW born overseas, and over 280 languages spoken, having access to books in your own language is incredibly important. Since 1974, the State Library has proudly provided books in community languages to the people of NSW through the local public library network. We now have 43 languages on offer.

Public libraries are some of the only spaces in society that people can use free of charge. It is powerful for people to be able to see themselves in such spaces, and it is at the heart of giving them a sense of belonging. Collections are at the core of the services public libraries provide — everyone should have access to information that meets their needs and be able to connect to their culture through stories and written language. We have been committed to making this possible since 1974.

Ideas for activities to celebrate throughout 2024

Here are some suggested activities to help you celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Multicultural Bulk Loan Service at your library. Please be as creative and colourful as you like.

1. Celebrate with your multicultural community in 2024

- Host a celebration event in your library. For example, a morning or afternoon tea.
- Explore recipes, art, songs, dances or games from around the world.
- Host bilingual storytimes and activities.
- Collaborate with your local community organisations.

2. Showcase the history of your multicultural community

- How has your multicultural community changed over time?
- Are there any significant events, buildings or interesting stories?
- Start collecting multicultural community stories for your local studies collection.

3. Spotlight on multicultural collections and the Multicultural Bulk Loan Service

- Place multicultural collections in prominent locations in your library and book displays.
- Order a mixed box of bulk loans from the State Library for a display of books in different languages. Bulk loan requestion form.
- Use the <u>downloadable promotional material</u> and <u>professionally translated phrases</u> to help promote the collection.

4. Promote your multicultural events and collection

- Submit short articles about your multicultural activities and programs for the <u>In the</u>
 Libraries e-newsletter we'd love to see more multicultural activities included
- Share your multicultural events and programs for 2024 with the NSW Public Library network through the Public library multicultural events for 2024 form.
- Promote your multicultural events on your social media and marketing channels.

The special edition pull-up banners can be **loaned** to your library for a limited time for your events.


