IFLA Trend Report 2022 Update

Each year IFLA releases their Trend Report. This report opens a dialogue between the library field and experts from a range of disciplines. By crossing experience and perspectives, it provides a new opportunity to explore and discuss the emerging trends that are shaping the world in which libraries work.

This new report follows on from the focus in the 2021 Trend Report which highlighted the key developments which are most likely to shape the future of the library field over the next Ten years. It is broken down into 3 main topics: Inspire, Enable & Connect.

Last month ALIA hosted a free talk on AI. You can now view the panel discussion about Artificial Intelligence, media and information literacy and the multiple implications for libraries of all stripes.

The panelists cover definitions, applications and existing AI tools, the issue of authorship and copyright. They discuss consumer-facing AI tools such as ChatGPT and what these tools might mean for the information ecosystem and what roles libraries might take.
