

Background of the project

Initially when we applied for the State Library funding grant we had a project in mind to record the oral histories of First Nations peoples connected with a large photographic collection which had been donated to the library.

Black Summer 2020

On New Years Eve of 2019 the threat to our area became very real. With the bush extremely dry, a fast moving fire started south of the Victorian border, this fire, which at the time became known as the border fire, raced out of control northwards up over the NSW border to devastate the bush and impact the communities of Wonboyn and surrounding areas

Creating connections

Following the bushfires a regular library customer told me about an idea for a new book where she was interviewing local residents of Wonboyn about their experience of the bushfires.

We partnered to combine her local connections with my training and equipment for recording oral histories


Recording on-site

I travelled out to the community to conduct the interviews on-site. Driving the 40 minutes it takes surrounded by an unending charred landscape, to interview community members in their homes, and for one couple, the undercover area out the front of their shed after they had lost their home.



Challenges

- Needed to establish procedures and protocols for the interviews
- ensuring that we had the correct permissions
- Ensuring that we recorded enough data at the time of the interview ie. not giving people advance notice that we would like to take a photo of them to accompany the recording
- Internal procedures for adding a new format of collection material to the catalogue


