
Ngarie and Joanna talk about their 'AFSQHC' experiences – Romance and Contemporary Fiction

Guess who sent that? Guess how we responded?
































What is Contemporary Fiction?

What's in the Contemporary Fiction list?


- Nearly everything you suggested to us
- And then everything else that couldn't comfortably fit in the other genres but was set in contemporary times


For example, books flagged as humorous.


Or books flagged as translated fiction.


Or books flagged as domestic fiction.

Or books flagged as bildungsroman (coming of age stories).













